Upon graduation, Ms. Rodriguez joined the Washington based architecture firm of Angelos Demetriou and Associates. During her tenure there she worked on a variety of projects with a focus on the Redevelopment of Asbury Park, New Jersey. This Project was a planning and architectural redevelopment of a square mile along the water. Project types were low-rise townhouse developments to a seventeen-story oceanfront condominium construction, 222 units. Additionally, there were commercial buildings associated with the residential uses. Her responsibilities ranged from design development, construction documentation and regulatory approval.

In 1992, Ms. Rodriguez, together with Eric Morrison, founded the firm of Morrison Architects. The firm has been active in the Washington DC metropolitan area since, then with several International projects now on the boards.
